Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." ¹⁶Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. ¹⁷And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' ¹⁸Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' ²⁰But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' ²¹So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."

Micah 1:2 – The Lord's judgment on all nations "Hear, you peoples, all of you; pay attention, O earth, and all that is in it, and let the Lord God be a witness against you, the Lord from his holy temple."

Micah 3:1–2 – Condemnation of unjust leaders "Hear, you heads of Jacob and rulers of the house of Israel!

Is it not for you to know justice?—
you who hate the good and love the evil..."

Micah 4:1–2 – A vision of peace and restoration "It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established as the highest of the mountains... and many nations shall come, and say: 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord... that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.'"

Micah 5:2 – The promise of a coming ruler from Bethlehem "But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days."

Micah 6:8 – The heart of God's requirements "He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"

Micah 7:18–19 – God's mercy and forgiveness "Who is a God like you, pardoning iniquity and passing over transgression for the remnant of his inheritance? He does not retain his anger forever, because he delights in steadfast love. He will again have compassion on us; he will tread our iniquities underfoot. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea."
