#### Pastor Randy's Ramblings:

Greetings to my Christian Brothers and Sisters of Bethlehem!

I hope God's Peace finds you well, as we approach the deep winter. So far however, if you're not a winter-fan like myself, there hasn't been too much to complain about.

<sup>21</sup> For surely you have heard about him and were taught in him, as truth is in Jesus, <sup>22</sup> to put away your former way of life, your old self, corrupt and deluded by its lusts, <sup>23</sup> and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, <sup>24</sup> and to clothe yourselves with the new self, created according to the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness. – Ephesians 4:21-24

In this passage, Paul addresses the "old self." As I write this, we are just past mid-January. January 17<sup>th</sup> was national "Ditch your New Years Resolution" day. How many of us may have had goals and plans for self-improvement, yet already feel like we've failed. Clearly, Paul was addressing SPIRITUAL self-improvement, but whether your goal was related to your relationship with God or not, I encourage you to not abandon your hope for a "NEW self" just yet. It's hard, but we CAN change!

I recently read an article in the Harvard Business Review titled, "What does it Really Take to Build a New Habit?" by Kristi DePaul. In her article, DePaul makes clear that "routine" and "habit" are not synonymous. A routine involves a behavior that is frequently and intentionally repeated.

#### Pastor Randy's Ramblings (continued):

A habit on the other hand, is a behavior that's carried out with little or no thought. For example, getting up at dawn to run, or journaling every night, are routines because they require conscious thought in order to carry them out. However, if you automatically go to the bathroom every night before bed and brush your teeth without really thinking about it, then that is a habit.


Confusion of these two concepts is what makes many people feel unsuccessful when trying to create a "new self." We fail to realize that something <u>must</u> become a ROUTINE before it can become a habit. Additionally, there are some routines that can never become habits because they require too much conscious thought. DePaul though, offers the following ideas for trying to turn routines into habits:

- Set your intentions: Decide what you want to accomplish and make sure it can reasonably become an "unconscious" habit. If it requires too much conscious attention to initiate, it will likely need to continue as "routine." Remember that patience, self-discipline, and commitment will be required. Charles Duhigg, author of <u>The Power of Habit</u>, says, "There's no such thing as 21 days to start a new habit. The amount of time it takes will vary from person to person." Habits that are pleasurable will be developed much more quickly than habits that require great effort. Another part of setting your intentions is to clearly articulate your reasons for the goal. WHY is forming this routine or habit meaningful to you?
- Prepare for roadblocks: Reflect on the reasons why this wasn't a normal behavior for you before. Imagine the things that might prevent you from meeting this goal, and develop a plan AHEAD of time for how you will handle the set-backs.
- Start with small steps: Make a schedule and build in time for your new routine and habit. Set "micro-habits" and build up to the behavior in increments.
- Try "temptation bundling": If the habit you're trying to create is necessary but not particularly fun, bundle it with something you enjoy. For example, watch your favorite show on Netflix while walking on the treadmill.
- Show yourself compassion: Recognize that change is hard and will take time. Celebrate the successes and be kind to yourself when you don't feel successful.

So what new routines or habits will you continue to work on past "Ditch your New Years Resolution" day? As always, I encourage you to develop a spiritual practice for yourself that deepens your relationship with God. Personally, I have been working on setting aside early morning time to be in relationship with Him. Shortly after rising, I go to my home office, light a candle, play soft music, pray, read scripture, and write about what comes to me. I have a very set <u>routine</u> that I use for the practice, and it's become such a part of my day that I look forward to it. I hope that you're able to create something meaningful for yourself, too. Embrace your "new self!" It IS within reach!





These gifts are given to help individuals become self sufficient in poor countries everywhere. Those who receive the gift animals also give others like themselves the first born of their own gift to widen the donation.

That \$2500 gift to Heifer International provided the following gifts to individuals in countries like Nepal, Uganda, Zambia, and Mexico. Bethlehem's donation will be 1 heifer, 3 sheep, 3 goats, 2 Alpacas, 2 pigs, 3 hives of honey bees, 10 flocks of chickens, 1 clean water well and 5 complete sets of garden seeds.

Heifer International hears from people world-wide whose lives have been changed through these gifts.
