

From Our Church Historian:

Did you know that Bethlehem UCC has a parsonage? The 118 year old house stands south of the current church in front the cemetery along Lax Chapel Road.

This house for the pastor was built in 1905 at a cost of \$850 for materials with the labor donated by members. Rev. Dahn was the first to occupy. It has been refurbished and remodeled many times; most notably adding running water in 1957.

Upon merger with Bethel in 1944, the pastors lived in the Bethel parsonage and our parsonage was occupied by custodians in exchange for their labor. In later years, pastors chose to live in the Bethlehem parsonage. Since the dissolution of the yoke with Bethel, pastors have chosen a housing allowance making the parsonage available to rent out to others.

WISE Update!!



This spring a group of Bethlehem members have been exploring the topic of mental health and are working towards a WISE designation. This designation would signify to others that Bethlehem is aware of the issues and needs surrounding mental health, and we openly accept and embrace those who struggle. WISE stands for Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, Engaging.

As a committee we read, <u>Blessed are the Crazy</u> by Rev. Sarah Lund. In the book she tells the story of living in family that has multiple members with significant mental health issues. Soon copies of the books will be available for others in the congregation to read.

On June 18, we had a member of the Manitowoc chapter of NAMI (National Alliance for Mental Illness) meet with our group. Not only was Donna knowledgeable about the mental health concerns of our county, but she also gave great testimony of her own struggles with significant mental health issues.

The next step is for the committee to begin educating the congregation. We are in the beginning stages of planning what that's going to look like. The goal is to remove the stigmas associated with mental health issues. Following that, we will explore ways that Bethlehem may be able to be a blessing to those dealing with mental health concerns. We would create a covenant and the congregation would vote on it. A covenant that creates a WISE designation is not a "once and done" mission project. It's a long term commitment to serve those that struggle.

At the Wisconsin Conference Annual Meeting in June, the delegation voted to make the Wisconsin Conference, a WISE conference. We are the 4th conference in the nation to do so. Churches across our state are also looking at ways to serve those with mental illnesses.

Period Pack - Menstrual Hygiene Kit Collection:



In may parts of the world, women and girls live in period poverty – lacking access to necessary feminine care supplies. During the menstrual cycle, these hygiene materials are especially important to healthy practices. Not having supplies like sanitary napkins, tampons, soap and disposable plastic bags can create challenges that lead to unsafe and unsanitary conditions.

Now you can help women and girls around the world living in period poverty. The CWS (Church World Services) Period Pack gives women and girls the essentials they need to feel clean, be healthy and live with dignity during the menstrual cycle.

During the months of May, June, July, August and September our Bethlehem family will be collecting menstrual hygiene supplies and will then assemble these kits as part of our Mission Fest Sunday. Supplies can be brought to church during these months.

Supplies Needed:

- One 1 gallon Ziploc bag
- Two 2 oz bottle hand sanitizer
- □ Three 4 gallon bathroom trash bags
- One travel pack of Wet Ones
- Ten unscented tampons (5 regular, 5 super absorbency)
- One bath-size bar of soap in the original package (3oz bar or larger. No Ivory or Jergen's soap)
- One pack of flushable wipes (Unscented. 42 count)
- Six laundry detergent sheets (place sheets in small Ziploc bag.)
- Monetary donations will also be accepted to put towards completing kits and shipping/processing fees
