Pastor Randy's Ramblings:

Dear Members of Bethlehem,

It was recently shared with me that someone referred to our church, Bethlehem UCC, as "dying." I'd like to respectfully disagree.

I honestly have no idea what the context of the comment was, but I'd like to say that I believe that **Bethlehem is THRIVING!** However, it's likely that my metric for "thriving" is vastly different from the commenter's. Has Bethlehem's overall membership dropped in the last ten years? Yes. Has Bethlehem's weekly attendance decreased? Yes, slightly. Are our Sunday School rooms full? No. Are younger families attending worship like they used to? No. Are our financial coffers overflowing? No.

On the surface, that all sounds bad. Of course, we'd LOVE for the answers to all the above questions to be the opposite, but they're not. Well guess what? The answers are the same for MOST churches in MOST denominations across the country. In August I gave a message that highlighted the decline in church attendance. Since 1965 the percentage of persons connected to a church has been steadily declining. Today, less than HALF of the American population claims a church affiliation. This is not a Bethlehem problem. This is not a UCC problem. This is an American problem. This is a <u>religious institution</u> problem. Quite frankly, younger people just don't find church to be of the same value that the older generations do. Until we find a way to reach them where they're at, they aren't coming back.

Pastor Randy's Ramblings (continued):

Two other huge factors that come into play are 1. Covid; people got too comfortable NOT coming to church, and 2. Youth sports; there are MANY things competing for a family's time. And now, unlike 20 years ago, youth sports programs find it necessary to schedule games and tournaments on Sundays.

So, with all this bad news, how is it possible that I could describe Bethlehem as "thriving?" Well, rather than continually keep the focus on who's NOT here, I like to focus on who IS here and what they are accomplishing. The goal of our church should be to serve God and God's people, not to fill the pews. If we had a full church but never did anything to make the world the better place, would we be "living?" I don't think so.

Even though our numbers are small, Bethlehem continues to do great things. Our close-knit group of members take seriously, God's call to action on behalf of his people. Every project we have undertaken recently has been a success. The Bethlehem Ladies held a VERY successful drive for the Harbor House. A large group of members gathered on Mission Sunday to make over 200

sandwiches, assemble 12 period packs, clean ditches on 2 miles of highway, and THEN went to play Bingo with residents at the Field of Dreams. Each time we ask our people to participate in a project, they rise to the occasion. Whether it's a food drive, the Christmas collection, Heifer Project, or Undy 500, Bethlehem delivers.

Let's avoid disparaging our church based on membership numbers, and instead CELEBRATE all the ways we unite and rally in care of God's people. And...if you want our church to grow, it's going to take YOU to invite people and make sure they give us a try. Sure, we don't have praise bands or light shows, but we've got beautifully faithful people, committed to serving God.

I am forever grateful to be a member of this faithful community!


A group also picked up garbage and trash along highway X.

From the Church Historian:

Did you know that Bethlehem UCC has a parsonage? The 118 year old house stands south of the current church in front the cemetery along Lax Chapel Road.

This house for the pastor was built in 1905 at a cost of \$850 for materials with the labor donated by members. Rev. Dahn was the first to occupy. It has been refurbished and remodeled many times; most notably adding running water in 1957.

Upon merger with Bethel in 1944, the pastors lived in the Bethel parsonage and our parsonage was occupied by custodians in exchange for their labor. In later years, pastors chose to live in the Bethlehem parsonage. Since the dissolution of the yoke with Bethel, pastors have chosen a housing allowance making the parsonage available to rent out to others.

<u>The Kiel Area Food Pantry, Inc</u> (which provides food to anyone within the Kiel School District Area), has been experiencing the largest needs ever faced in our community. Last year in November they hit 42 households, in the last two months more than 80 households have needed support.

The pantry is ecumenical-- open to everyone. There is a huge need in our community. Each month boxes include cheese donated from Hennings and Sargento, butter donated by Pine River Dairy ---- the pantry then purchases meat to add to the box. The months that normally see the most need are October, November and December.

The pantry has served an all-time high of 80+ households. If anyone does not want to do shopping, or would like to help donate money towards meat, cash donations are also welcome.
