### Pastor Randy's Ramblings:

Dear Members of Bethlehem,

God's grace and peace be with you as we enter into the season of Advent! Yes, we have reached the close of one church year and are now entering another. Perhaps your holiday decorating and preparations are well underway as we anticipate the birth of the baby Jesus! May the season of Advent bring a sense of hope, peace, love, and joy in you!

In my personal life, I too, am at a point of transition. Many of you know that this fall I participated in a Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) course. This work was part of my efforts to become an ordained pastor within the United Church of Christ. It required ten hours of online class per week, as well as 20 clinical hours as a chaplain at the hospital in Sheboygan. Those requirements are now complete. It was a busy and intense time, but I learned so much, some of which I'd like to share with you in my ramblings this month.

The first thing I learned, is that chaplaincy is not always about religion. As chaplains, we are present to provide <u>spiritual</u> support – whatever that looks like to the patient! The topic of religion was seldom mentioned unless the patient brought it up. More often than not, I engaged in conversations around a patient's hopes, fears, goals, and level of support. Occasionally, patients would describe how GOD factored into those areas of their lives. If not, I was not there to push religion, but to support the patient with a listening ear. ### Pastor Randy's Ramblings (continued):

The second thing I'm taking away from my experience is that we have a MORAL obligation to take care of ourselves and our health. I encountered so many people who lived lives filled with self-destructive habits and a lack of attention to their health and well-being. Later in life, these habits and lack of care CAN catch up with us. Sometimes that requires our children to either care for us or make decisions on our behalf. I met so many people who were distraught by the responsibilities they faced, having to care for an elderly, sick parent. Clearly, some health conditions are characteristic of growing old and can't be helped. My comments are geared more towards preventable health issues caused by poor self-care and/or destructive habits.

Along with that, I'd also like to highlight the importance of advance planning directives. Many adult children are saddled with making difficult decisions for their parents, or worse yet, NO ability to make decisions because the patient hadn't designated a medical power of attorney. In those cases, the courts have gotten involved. PLEASE, complete your advance directives and designate an alternate decision maker in the event you can't decide for yourself. Discuss with loved ones in advance, your preferences for life-saving measures, quality of life, etc. It will make things much easier in the event these choices have to be made. I am looking at having a guest speaker come to speak to our congregation about these important actions.

And finally, HIPPA is real and taken very seriously in health care. In the old days, if you were admitted to the hospital, the hospital might call your church pastor and let him/her know you were hospitalized. That doesn't happen anymore due to HIPPA privacy laws. When admitted, they will ask you if you want a chaplain visit. Say, "Yes!" and when the chaplain comes, you can ask him or her to call your pastor. Another great option is to have a family member let the pastor know you're in the hospital.

All in all, I can't say enough about my CPE experience. I enjoyed every moment and learned a lot about pastoral care and myself! Fear not, though! I have no ambitions to move towards chaplaincy! I am very pleased and content to remain as your congregational leader. Hopefully a BETTER leader from what I learned in CPE! I'd love to share more about my experience with you if you're interested!

God be with you in this Advent season!

### From the Church Historian:

The following was written by Heidi Konen and read at Bethlehem's November 19, 2023 worship Service:

Today we are here to celebrate Bethlehem Ladies Aid being 110 years old. It all started back in 1913 under the leadership of Rev. Caleb Hauser. There were 13 women. At that time dues were \$.15 a month.

Through the years the ladies have been busy doing fundraising and other projects to help raise money. They help with buying the organ, furniture, and carpeting.

In 1957 an addition was added on to the church for which the ladies pledged \$2000. They made quilts, laprobes for the local nursing homes. Many times they did refunding where certain items were done by collecting UPC codes off items and that was sent in and the ladies were sent gifts for which we used as gifts and door prizes. Bingo was a great way back then and we now have been doing at the nursing homes.

Back in 1983 through 1995 Bethlehem Ladies sponsored a child's schooling in India.

In 2006 we changed our name from Bethlehem Ladies Aid to Bethlehem Ladies. Each year we give a scholarship of \$100.00 to any UCC person that chooses to go to a Seminary Collage or some type of religious field work. We buy handkerchiefs for baptisms and at time we go to Field of Dreams to play Bingo so as to visit with Doris Mae and Merlin so as to remember two very special people of our congregation.

Today our Bethlehem Ladies have dwindled down to 8, but we still meet and get the job done. Sounds like fun, right? If anyone is interested in joining, just come and speak to one of us. 110 years ago the women in the Bethlehem Ladies group had big dreams. The current members strive to continue those dreams so as to not forget the history of Bethlehem UCC – "The Little White Church on the Hill".
