Pastor Randy's Ramblings:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are roughly a third of the way through Lent. Last month I invited/encouraged you to take on some sort of spiritual practice to deepen your relationship with God during these forty days. Have you started one? Does anyone really read these things, anyway?

I, myself, couldn't choose just one, so I actually engage in two daily devotionals. The first was written by Kate Bowler, the author whom I've shared with you on multiple occasions, and the second is on the abidingway.life website which I shared on the church Facebook page on Ash Wednesday. What I like about the second one, is that in addition to a reflection, it connects to a Christian song and its lyrics. More on that, later.

- ¹⁰ Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.
- ¹¹ Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me.
- ¹² Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit. – Psalm 51

These words from Psalm 51 talk about the essence of an important Lenten theme: Repentance. This is a topic we discuss a LOT during Lent, but what does *repentance* entail?

Pastor Randy's Ramblings (continued):

Unfortunately, the concept of repentance has been co-opted and misrepresented by many Christian groups. Perhaps, we have even been led to understand repentance as the command to some sort of moral reform and behavior modification. This idea hinges on the belief that almost everything we do is wrong in God's eyes and if we'd just stop screwing up and do all the <u>right</u> things, THEN God will love us. This version of a God who's always angry and looking for reasons to punish us, leads to nothing but shame and disillusionment.

A recent devotion on abidingway.life explains that the above understanding of repentance is not *biblical* repentance. Their writer explains that repentance in the bible is rooted in the "love and mercy of God." The focus isn't so much on our ability to change ourselves, but rather on how GOD effects change in us through the Holy Spirit. We surrender ourselves to God and approach God with an attitude of humility and a willingness to be transformed into the person God wishes us to be. God invites us to repent out of God's kindness, not God's judgement. Paul writes in Romans 2:4, "Do you not realize that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance?" Titus 3: 4-7 puts it like this:

⁴But when the goodness and loving-kindness of God our Savior appeared, ⁵he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit.

In other words, repentance isn't about us doing the right things, it's about a willingness within us, to allow the Holy Spirit to CHANGE us. God doesn't love us because we repent, rather we repent because God loves us. The biblical understanding of repentance comes from the Hebrew word *shub* (to turn) and the Greek *metanoein* (to think anew). Rather than be ashamed of the ways we feel unworthy of God's love, during this Lenten season, how can we allow God's spirit to enter our hearts, to turn us and make us think anew?

In 1985, singer Leslie Phillips released a song called, "Your Kindness." The chorus of the song explains the essence of biblical repentance:

It's Your kindness
That leads us to repentance O Lord
Knowing that You love us
No matter what we do
Makes us want to love You, too

May God's Spirit be at work within you in these forty days of Lent!





From the Church Historian, Kaye Radder:

rch While preparing for the February 7, 2024 chili supper, some discussion turned to Historian reminiscing about previous chili suppers.

Note that one question was "how long have we been doing this?" Based on the recollection of some members it's been about 75 years. More digging may turn up a date, but it's certain that it's been a long long time tradition at Bethlehem.

Here are some interesting notes from some recent chili suppers:

- 1997 the chili supper was delayed one day due to bad weather. This was at the old church.
- 2001 Noon deliveries began. Ron Schreiber mentioned that some of his co-workers at A.A. Laun could not make the evening meal. So lunchtime meals were delivered.
- 2007 ticket price \$5
- 2009 Electrical power went out during the noon lunch preparations. Back up plans were being discussed. How and/or where can we get the chili cooked? Fortunately, power came back on within 15 minutes.
- 2011 the chili supper was delayed one day due to bad weather. This was at the new church.
- 2015 record year for number of people served. Total reported as 1,406 with 619 of those being noon lunches.
- 2019 ticket price \$8
- 2021 started selling Gallons of chili in addition to the meal. Ran out of chili by 5 pm

Chili Supper

Thank you to all who made the 2024 Bethlehem Chili Supper successful. Approximately 60 people contributed time, skills, and talent throughout the planning and operation of this event.

We cooked up and distributed about 1140 servings of Bethlehem chili. During the day, noon lunches were delivered to 237 people. The rest of the servings were done via our drive thru/pick up operation, 55 gallons and 410 individual meal deals. The good news: **we sold out**. We will cook more in 2025.

The greatest success of the day was seeing and hearing old friends reuniting with smiling faces and stories. Some new acquaintances were made. The people of Bethlehem truly know how to work together towards a common goal. The measurement of this success cannot be calculated.

One of the successes of the day which we can measure is monetary profit. For 2024 each of our church organizations will receive approximately \$800 to use for their various projects and missions.

If you know someone who works in food service such as a deli or restaurant, consider asking if they get product in covered plastic containers that might be thrown away. Ask if they could be donated to the church.




