Pastor Randy's Ramblings:

Greetings, people of Bethlehem! God's grace and peace be with you all.

As the month of May closes, we hope that you found some meaning in Bethlehem's focus on mental health. During Mental Health Awareness month, the WISE team attempted to educate the congregation and eradicate the stigma that surrounds mental health concerns. Without a doubt, each and every one of us has mental health concerns to varying degrees. Our goal is to normalize, not demonize discussions on mental illness. As I tried to reiterate in my May 5 message: it's not their fault.

We hope you had the chance to hear our guest speaker, Maggie Boyd, on May 19. From a young age, she had mental health issues which were never addressed or treated. Rather, she was always considered the "problem child." Eventually her mental health struggles led her to substance abuse, addiction, and ultimately incarceration. It wasn't until THAT point that her mental health struggles were identified. She finally had no choice but to confront her addiction and address her illnesses. She succeeded, and now counsels others who are battling substance abuse. Maggie is a success story today, but it's unfortunate she had to suffer so long. My heart breaks to think of all those still battling or whose mental illnesses have yet to be addressed.


LOOKING FOR LITURGISTS!

From the Historical Records of Bethlehem U.C.C.



Pastor Melinda Feller recently announced her retirement while serving the congregations at St. John's UCC (Schwartzwald) and St Paul's UCC (Malone). She had served Bethlehem from July of 1991 through April of 2002. This was one of the longest terms for a pastor of Bethlehem.

Calling a female pastor in 1991 was a bit of a controversy for the yoked parishes of Bethel and Bethlehem UCC. The churches had been yoked since 1944 and always been served by male pastors, with the exception of two interims, Pastor Wanda Veldman and Barbara Loose.

Melinda Feller was born in Kendalville, Indiana and raised in Michigan. She graduated from Morley-Stanwood High School in Morley Michigan. Furthering her education she attended University of Michigan and Michigan State University. She attended Seminary of the Twin Cities where she graduated May 1991.

She was ordained at Flasher UCC, Flasher, North Dakota on June 9, 1991. Four members of Bethlehem traveled to Flasher to attend her ordination service.

Several weeks later, three members of Bethlehem drove to St. Paul to load her household items in a U-Haul. Then the next day driving to the parsonage at Bethlehem. Other members were ready to greet Pastor Melinda, unload and help her get settled into her new home. *Continued on page 12*

During her ministry at Bethlehem, she married 18 couples, baptized 42 children, confirmed 38 youth and presided over the funeral service of 20 members.

In addition to leading worship services each week at Bethel and Bethlehem, Pastor Melinda:

- Encouraged several members to attend Lay Academy
- Was an advocate for Crop Walk and Heifer Project
- Saw the church get a new organ in June 1999
- Supported various fund raising efforts including putting together a church cookbook, operating a food stand at Farm Progress Days, and holding an annual garage sale.
- Promoted the work of small groups in special events such as the Maundy Thursday plays, Christmas Cantatas, and a float for the Kiel parade.
- Initiated a Sunrise Easter Service followed by Easter Breakfast.
- Encouraged joint events with the Bethel congregation including a picture directory of members.
- Saw modifications of the parsonage such as a deck and fire escape.
- Began first communion classes for youth. Previously only confirmed members were invited to share the Lord's Supper

On July 14, 2001 Bethlehem UCC presented Pastor Melinda with a plaque commemorating 10 years of service with the church. (She was also given the day off from leading worship that day.)

Pastor Melinda left the Bethel and Bethlehem in April 2002 after the yoke was dissolved. Per her calling contract, Pastor Melinda could only serve both churches, not one or the other.

She went on to serve Immanuel UCC in Kaukauna, Wisconsin, Roberts UCC in Roberts, Wisconsin, St. John's UCC, Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin, and St. Paul's UCC, Malone, Wisconsin.



Anxiety Disorders

Everyone experiences anxiety. However, when feelings of intense fear and distress are overwhelming and prevent us from doing everyday things, an anxiety disorder may be the cause. Anxiety disorders are the most common mental health concern in the United States. An estimated 40 million adults in the U.S., or 18%, have an anxiety disorder. Approximately 8% of children and teenagers experience the negative impact of an anxiety disorder at school and at home.

Symptoms

Just like with any mental illness, people with anxiety disorders experience symptoms differently. But for most people, anxiety changes how they function day-to-day. People can experience one or more of the following symptoms:

Emotional symptoms:

- •Feelings of apprehension or dread
- Feeling tense and jumpy
- Restlessness or irritability
- Anticipating the worst and being watchful for signs of danger

Physical symptoms:

- Pounding or racing heart and shortness of breath
- Upset stomach
- Sweating, tremors and twitches
- Headaches, fatigue and insomnia
- Upset stomach, frequent urination or diarrhea

Types of Anxiety Disorders

Different anxiety disorders have various symptoms. This also means that each type of anxiety disorder has its own treatment plan. The most common anxiety disorders include:

•Panic Disorder. Characterized by panic attacks—sudden feelings of terror—sometimes striking repeatedly and without warning. Often mistaken for a heart-attack, a panic attack causes powerful, physical symptoms including chest pain, heart palpitations, dizziness, shortness of breath and stomach upset.

- •Phobias. Most people with specific phobias have several triggers. To avoid panicking, someone with specific phobias will work hard to avoid their triggers. Depending on the type and number of triggers, this fear and the attempt to control it can seem to take over a person's life.
- •Generalized Anxiety Disorder (GAD). GAD produces chronic, exaggerated worrying about everyday life. This can consume hours each day, making it hard to concentrate or finish routine daily tasks. A person with GAD may become exhausted by worry and experience headaches, tension or nausea.
- •Social Anxiety Disorder. Unlike shyness, this disorder causes intense fear, often driven by irrational worries about social humiliation—"saying something stupid," or "not knowing what to say." Someone with social anxiety disorder may not participate in conversations, contribute to class discussions, or offer their ideas, and may become isolated. Panic attack symptoms are a common reaction.

Causes

Scientists believe that many factors combine to cause anxiety disorders:

- •Genetics. Some families will have a higher than average numbers of members experiencing anxiety issues, and studies support the evidence that anxiety disorders run in families. This can be a factor in someone developing an anxiety disorder.
- •Stress. A stressful or traumatic situation such as abuse, death of a loved one, violence or prolonged illness is often linked to the development of an anxiety disorder.

Diagnosis

The physical symptoms of an anxiety disorder can be easily confused with other medical conditions like heart disease or hyperthyroidism. Therefore, a doctor will likely perform a carefully evaluate involving a physical examination, an interview and ordering lab tests. After ruling out a medical illness, the doctor may recommend a person see a mental health professional to make a diagnosis.

Treatment

As each anxiety disorder has a different set of symptoms, the types of treatment that a mental health professional may suggest also can vary. But there are common types of treatment that are used:

- Psychotherapy, including cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT)
- Medications, including anti-anxiety medications and antidepressants
- Complementary health approaches, including stress and relaxation techniques.
