Greetings people of Bethlehem!

EB White, author of the famed children's classic, <u>Charlotte's Web</u>, once wrote, *"I arise in the morning torn between a desire to improve the world and a desire to enjoy the world. This makes it hard to plan the day."*

In our society, we are driven. Not only do we maintain fast-paced schedules of work, social obligations, and children's activities, but there's an unwritten expectation in our culture to make a "contribution"... to leave our marks and to do something positive for the good of our fellow citizens. And don't get me wrong, these are worthy goals! But often, we sustain this breakneck way of life at the expense of self-care. We are moving from one thing to the next so quickly, that we fail to slow down, and as EB White puts it, "enjoy the world."

There are many scriptural references to creation and nature, but perhaps the most significant passage comes from the creation story, Genesis 1:9-12

And God said, 'Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear.' And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, 'Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it.' And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good.

Indeed, it IS good, and we should find ways to purposefully connect with God as we take in God's creation.

Wisconsin author, Holly Whitcomb, authored a short book titled, <u>The</u> <u>Practice of Finding</u>. In the book she writes about what she calls, "learning to savor." Savoring is the intentional practice of noticing small things that create wonder and peace in your heart. When was the last time you allowed yourself to be alone... specifically attuned and appreciative of things that stimulated your senses? The gentle call of the oriole or cardinal, the beauty of the sunlight as it filters through the leaves, the scent of lilacs as it wafts in the breeze, the coolness of the grass on the soles of your bare feet.



Whitcomb offers the following spiritual practice to help us learn to savor: "Choose a particular day on which you will make yourself aware of beauty three times: in the morning, in the afternoon, and in the evening. Notice the impact this has on your perspective. Do you feel more joyful? More grateful? If so, you might want to make this practice a daily one."

An old Jewish saying can remind us of the importance of savoring in this way. It goes, "On the day of Judgment, God will ask only one question: Did you enjoy my world?"

I hope that as summer unfolds, you can find time to slow down and savor the beauty of God's creation.


LOOKING FOR LITURGISTS!

- $_{\odot}$ The choir hosted four chili suppers in the years 1957 thru 1960.
- o In 1961, Jeanette Wriedt organized and directed the Junior Choir.
- In 1978, when the choir was 50 years old, Mabel Bratz was honored as a charter member.
 The choir liked to keep things simple. Here is the pledge choir members signed in 1937.




Bethlehem W.I.S.E. PAGE
