Pastor Randy's Ramblings:

Hello Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

I hope your summer has been enjoyable thus far and that you've been able to enjoy some family and leisure time. It seems to have gone by very fast.

Most of us at Bethlehem are probably old enough to remember the terrorist attack of 9/11/2001. Although it was a devastating and tragic event, I remember one "positive" thing about it... the people of America joined together. In the weeks and months that followed, we lined the streets for parades. Waving our flags and expressing our appreciation to fire fighters and other emergency personnel who risk their lives in the interest of public safety. Despite the fear of future attacks and grief over the horrific unnecessary loss of life, America was ONE! We set aside our partisan differences and united for the good of our country. Wow, what a complete 180 this country has done!

On Sunday, July 21st, I delivered a message based partly on the lectionary text of Ephesians 2: 11-22. In this passage, Paul is speaking to the members of the Gentile community at the church in Ephesus. At the time, there was much hostility and conflict between the Jews and the Gentiles of the region. Paul makes the case that now that the Gentiles have come to know and accept Jesus, the Gentiles and Jews were now one. ¹³But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. In other words, the blood of Christ compels us to set aside the hostilities that create divisions between us. Christ is the essence of peace and makes all his followers ONE in unity.

Pastor Randy's Ramblings (continued):

Later verses in the passage are important as well. ¹⁹So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, ²⁰built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. ²¹In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; ²²in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling-place for God. Our very relationships with other believers create what Paul called the "household of God," built upon Christ as the "cornerstone." When we are at peace with one another, Christ unites us into a holy temple that creates a "dwelling-place for God." GOD IS WITH US, when we are joined as one in unity and peace.

Sadly, the converse is true as well. If we are in conflict with others and harbor hostilities, we have actually taken God's "dwelling place" and allowed those emotions of anger, resentment, animosity, and even hatred, to become <u>squatters</u> in the space that God is supposed to occupy. Multiple scriptural texts support the notion that we must be at peace with one another to truly know the presence of God. (for example, 1 John 2:9 - Whoever says he is in the light and hates his brother is still in darkness.)

The United States is gearing up for what will surely be a very toxic presidential campaign season and election. I know that at Bethlehem we have people on both sides of the political aisle. Personally, I'm happy for that. I think diversity of thought is good for society. As much as we might WANT to make the claim that God is on OUR side, it's important to remember he's not.

God doesn't have a political party affiliation. St Peter say in Acts 10:34 – "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality."

As we draw closer to election season, may we, the members of Bethlehem, model the love, civility, respect, and grace that our Lord calls us to impart. Not just within the confines of our church, but everywhere! Demonstrate what Christianity in America is SUPPOSED to look like! Let's bring back the American unity that followed 9/11. For it is not in division and hostility that we come closer to God, but it is though peace and oneness that God comes to dwell among us.

May you have a blessed August. It is my privilege to lead this wonderful community of believers.

Bethlehem Sunday School:


Thank you to the kids who are helping with the jingle change collection. It is really nice to see them being a part of the service.



July/August 2024

Bethlehem is on an exciting journey in which we as a church family seek to become informed advocates for individuals struggling with mental health challenges.

In doing so we will become part of a national effort by the UCC to choose to become **WISE**. This acronym means we are **Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged** around issues of mental illness.
