Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

God's peace be with you as we enter the month of November. If the speed of the last two months is any indication, Christmas will be over before we know it.

During the month of October, did you find yourself feeling reflective, contemplative, even motivated? If so, you are not alone. There's been a movement on social media that's being dubbed "October Theory." The idea behind it is, that because of the changing seasons and the possible anticipation of the holiday season, we too, are prone to begin thinking about change, transformation and renewal.

There isn't any real science or data behind this theory; it's just a concept. And there's more to it than just setting resolutions or goals. As the seasons transition, there's still three months left of the year to make changes. We reflect not just setting new goals, but on evaluating what we've BEEN doing. Are there areas of our lives where a" fresh start" might be beneficial? It's just about looking towards the future, but also about evaluating the past.


LOOKING FOR LITURGISTS!




CAPS AND EGG CARTONS:

From the Historical Records of Bethlehem U.C.C.

Do you remember when Bethlehem UCC hosted a Pork Roast Supper? For seven years, from 2006 to 2012, the fellowship hall of Bethlehem UCC was the site of a scrumptious meal.

The kitchen was bustling with activity as the menu included a Roast Pork Sandwich, Sauerkraut, Applesauce, Baked Beans, Relishes, Potato Chips, Refrigerator Pickles, Pickles Beets, Barbeque Sauce and Horseradish. Ice Cream Sundaes with Strawberry, Chocolate or Caramel Topping for dessert. All this for only \$7.50. The second year, Parsley Potatoes and a cheese wedge were added to the meal.

"The Pork Supper Committee chose a slogan of "Bethlehem's going Hog Wild". Last year's supper was a new event, but with the help of many volunteers it was deemed a huge success and plans for this year's event began immediately. The "Hog Wild" theme is being carried out in the advertising Big Pig signs located throughout the community. When this group starts planning, the wild ideas start flowing.

When planning for a new building, the building committee knew that the plans had to include the space to carry on the tradition of serving a great "church" meal. With the completion of the new building, the members of Bethlehem are discovering creative new ways to use the building in carrying out the mission of the church.

This special event allows the church to open its doors, invite the public to share the warm welcoming atmosphere. The event also allows the church to raise some funds to pay for the building and provide seed funds for the Bethlehem Mission Group. This group plans and organizes various hands on projects within the community and beyond."




With proceeds from the brat fry and rummage sale, the Merry Christians are making donations to the Kiel Food Pantry and the Immanuel Food Pantry.

We would like to **thank you** for responding with your thoughts replying to the anonymous survey we sent out to the congregation. This required you to think about your feelings and the struggles of people close to you. Your voice matters and with this help the WISE team can develop a program that targets the issues that matter most to you and our church.

Please know that we are together, that you are not alone.

We are providing a summary of the survey results:

Throughout your life you have learned many ways to cope with challenges. The top five that you have relied upon to help you through times of difficulty, pain, and stress:
