Pastor Randy's Ramblings (continued):

This Lenten season, one of the things I'll be reading is a book by James Moore titled Give Up Something Bad for Lent. It challenges the Christian to move beyond giving up Facebook, wine, or chocolate, and instead focus on harmful attitudes or behaviors such as resentment, jealousy, or apathy. Unfortunately, my copy did not arrive before I had to write this article, so I couldn't include any specific ideas from it. However, I'm writing this article just prior to the 7th Sunday after Epiphany and the passage from Luke 6:27-38 has me thinking about vengeance and revenge. These would be great things to give up for Lent.

Jesus said, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you... But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return... Forgive, and you will be forgiven;

These selected verses from the above passage, all speak to loving and forgiving those we might call our enemies, those who might harass and disparage us. It is one of many passages where Jesus calls his followers to forgiveness rather than vengeance. The desire to "get even" is often our first instinct. When someone hurts or harms us, we wish similar hurt and harm to fall upon that person.

This vindictive desire for retribution and payback also permeates our culture and society right now. And sadly, people we consider our enemies may not have DIRECTLY harmed us in any way. In our toxic climate our enemies might be people who look differently than we do... who speak differently than we do... who believe differently than we do... who vote differently than we do... who love differently than we do... And don't we love it, when they get what they deserve! It feels good to watch them squirm... it feels good to watch them struggle... it feels good to get revenge...! Karma, baby! There's just one problem. Our appetite for retribution, our cries of "take that!" are NOT in the spirit of

Christ. They are contrary to Jesus' call to LOVE our enemies, pray and do good for those who hate us, and to FORGIVE those who have done us wrong. Calls for vindictive karma are not Christ-like.

This Lenten season I challenge you to the hard work of changing your attitudes and desire for revenge. We are reminded in both Deuteronomy 32 and Romans 12 that vengeance is not ours to dole out. "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay," says the Lord. When we have a more loving, forgiving attitude towards our "enemies," we will be in better relationship with God. DAYS DAYS DEREC

WISE Covenant – Jane Umland

The WISE team has been working for the past two years to learn about mental health, and then to educate the congregation. We have kept our family at Bethlehem updated and involved with our journey to become WISE in our library is a section in the bookcase with the book "Blessed are the Crazy" we had 2 book study sessions with members joining in with discussion. \cdot Resource Materials from NAMI National Alliance of Mental Illness in Manitowoc County for you to explore. \cdot Guest Speakers during Worship Sundays, Donna Firman, president of NAMI, National Alliance of Mental Illness in Manitowoc. Maggie Boyd, sharing her story.

The month of May was Mental Health Awareness. The WISE team educated our congregation with events each Sunday and then lead a worship on May 19th. We reviewed the result of an anonymous survey asking for your feelings and struggles of people close to you. As your voice matters with this help for the WISE team to develop a program that targets the issues that matter most to you and our church. The WISE team completed many poster boards with information about Mental Health Illness and education on how to help others going through mental health.

1. What is a WISE Congregation?

To Be Certified WISE: Welcoming/Inclusion/Supportive/Engaged

Our objectives are to promote understanding and compassion, reduce stigma through education and to support connections with local community agencies that advocate for those living with these challenges. We are not doctors and cannot cure these challenges and issues, but we strive to learn ways to provide support and listen to people who need help.

One thing we have come to learn on our WISE journey is that the people we need to help the most.... are ourselves. All of us have faced challenges at times that often reflect one of the many faces of mental challenges and issues.

We want to continue to grow our WISE ministry and explore how the stigma can be reduced or removed by including teens and other young people from our community and churches; and by making monthly meetings available to anyone interested in hearing how others are dealing with issues and learning with us, in a confidential environment, that those with mental health issues are not alone

Know that this is the beginning of WISE, not the end.

Going forward we'll be looking for more involvement on how we can engage the community in mental health, like community workshops, opening our doors to organizations who might need space for meetings, training, etc. the possibilities are endless.

In your Annual Report, the WISE team has written a COVENANT.

WISE Covenant of Bethlehem United Church of Christ of Kiel, WI

Bethlehem United Church of Christ of Kiel, Wisconsin has embraced the UCC General Synod's call to become a Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive and Engaged (WISE) congregation for mental health. With Jesus as our model for how to live and love, we strive to provide a warm welcome, promote inclusion, and offer support for all who live with mental health challenges and to those who love and support them. We strive to promote understanding and compassion, reduce stigma through education and support activities, and partner with local community agencies that advocate for those living with these challenges.

At Bethlehem we seek to be a community that cares for the whole person. We recognize that mental wellness is on a continuum and that stressors, loss, and life events can challenge us at any point. Since one in four people is living with a diagnosable mental health condition, it is safe to say that many among us and those we encounter in our lives are dealing with mental health and substance abuse challenges every day. Others may struggle with brain disorders such as dementia, autism, and traumatic brain injury. Our congregation's atmosphere of openness and acceptance makes members, friends, and visitors more likely to feel safe and free from judgment. This acceptance and sense of safety can create a place of belonging where truly everyone, no matter where they are on life's journey towards mental wellness, is welcome.

By voting on this today will allow us to explore the struggles with mental health spiritually. God is still speaking in us and we are willing to learn and help. Isn't this what it's all about.

Thank you to all who made the 2025 Bethlehem Chili Supper successful. Approximately 60 people contributed time, skills, and talent throughout the planning and operation of this event.

We cooked up and distributed about 1200 servings of Bethlehem chili. During the day, noon lunches were delivered to 249 people. The rest of the servings were done via our drive thru/pick up operation, 64 gallons and 422 individual meal deals. The good news: **we sold out**.

The greatest success of the day was seeing and hearing old friends reuniting with smiling faces and stories. Some new acquaintances were made. The people of Bethlehem truly know how to work together towards a common goal. The measurement of this success cannot be calculated.

One of the successes of the day which we can measure is monetary profit. For 2025 each of our church organizations will receive approximately \$800 to use for their various projects and missions.
